A 1980S HOUSE GETS A NEW LAYOUT AND DECOR TO FIT A BUSY BERKELEY LAKE FAMILY

These days Cristi Holcombe is busy juggling interior design projects and her store and showroom CH Home (as well as family life), but the Alabama native got her start on HGTV's Elbow Room. On that popular show, she was the production designer and worked on 39 renovations seen on national television.

nterior designer Cristi Holcombe knows the charms-and the drawbacks-of houses from a certain era because she lives in one herself. So, when Lindsay and Jesse Rhodenbaugh asked her to update their '80s Colonial home, she recognized right away what should be changed: honey-colored flooring, small doorways, and seldom-used rooms. A formal living room wasn't used much at all, recalls Cristi, adding that the most used room in the home-the kitchen-was dark and in the back of the house. "Our main goal was always function, but we also wanted to make it pretty," she says. The remodel tackled several objectives: reconfiguring the first floor, repurposing rooms, and adding storage and organization galore-all while elevating the look with color and texture.

Homeowners Lindsay and Jesse, entrepreneurs with three young children, knew they needed a house that better served their busy life. Cristi decided to move the kitchen as one big change, bringing it up front for better natural light. A switch to white-oak flooring throughout the first floor brought a more up-to-date look to the main level and inspired accents such as ceiling beams and butcher block in the kitchen to tie it all together. New archways and millwork added architectural charm, but Cristi made sure it looked intentional. "We wanted the house to look it was always supposed to be like this," says the designer.

Two areas particularly show her creative mix of form and function. The family's dining room (now called the "flex space," says the designer) benefits from built-ins that look stylish but also hide arts and crafts, games, and homework supplies. Elegant blue cabinetry, banquette seating, and a chevron-patterned wood ceiling elevate this practical room, moving it beyond a typical dining area. A mudroom off the kitchen also channels a happy blue vibe and serves multiple purposes with lockers for the family, a prep sink, and a washer and dryer.


When it came to furnishings and accessories, Cristi kept the theme mostly neutral and nature-inspired. Off-white walls and creamy white furniture mix with wood and metal accents, but the designer included another element. "Texture is huge for me," says Cristi. "It's a way to add interest without a lot of color." Rattan and velvet, butcher block, and shiplap are textural combos that add dimension to the house. Where more saturated hues are used—the dining room/flex space and mudroom, for instance—the designer chose blue tones that complement lighter rooms.

If Cristi's abilities for problem-solving appear seamless, it may be because she spent years as a production designer on HGTV's Elbow Room, where creativity and flexibility were the name of the game. She was also able to source furniture and accessories from her Johns Creek store CH Home, an invaluable resource for all her clients. As north Atlanta has thrived-with city centers such as Johns Creek and Alpharetta-Cristi and the Rhodenbaughs are able to run businesses, raise families, and take advantage of natural beauty up that way, while knowing there's a comfortable house waiting for them back home.
